We work very closely with other faith groups and secular institutions including: Building Bridges Burnley (our local Interfaith Group); New Neighbours Together (Asylum Seeker & Refugee Project); Church of the Nazarene; Burnley Football Club; Dementia Action Alliance plus many charities including Christian Aid, Tearfund, CAFOD etc in order to bring about change and transformation in the local community and beyond.

Ecumenical/Interfaith/Asylum Seeker Project activities include: Christian Aid Lunch; Holocaust Memorial Town Centre Service; Taize Prayers (during Lent); Lenten Bible Studies; Lenten Lunches; Women's World Day of Prayer; Holy Week School Assemblies (when schools are not on holiday); Maundy Thursday (joint worship URC/Anglicans/Baptists); Good Friday United Events; Christian Aid Week – house to house collection and coffee mornings; 'Thy Kingdom Come' events (this year (2018) a huge event to mark the Royal Wedding); Pentecost – Unity Service plus 'Picnic in the Park'; Remembrance Sunday – Town Centre Memorial Service; Blessing of the Crib in the town centre; Advent Service at the Faith Centre; Christmas Carol Service at Burnley Football Club (up to 300 folks, young children/families attend and lead the service); Magdalene Centre (counselling service); Voice of the Church (Burnley Express); Burnley Older People's Forum.

At previous meetings we identified several areas of activity for Churches Working Together in Burnley:

- To mark events within the Christian Year – not duplicating what we are already doing or 'doing more' but thinking if there is something that we are better able to do together, and to spot the gaps. (E.g. Churches' response to Refugee Crisis)
- To build better relationships between Christian communities in Burnley so that our relationship is real – not just on paper. We recognise and appreciate theological and denominational differences but want our diversity to enrich rather than divide.
- To support our town and our communities through ministry and prayer sharing God's love in action
